Introduction

The Sediment Master Plan (“SMP”) is an innovative collaboration between the State of California Resources Agency and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Its goal is to develop an implementation strategy for regional sediment management in California. It will provide a comprehensive, system-wide overview of sediment management issues, needs and solutions. It will set priorities, and develop an integrated management framework to allow local, regional, state and federal entities to work together to effectively solve coastal sediment problems. Typical issues that the SMP will deal with include beach erosion, sea cliff failure, wetlands sedimentation and related water quality and habitat impacts, and harbor dredging.

The SMP process just started in 2003 and is anticipated to extend for several more years. In order to be effective the SMP will need to establish working relationships with the state’s many local and regional organizations working on issues related to coastal sediment problems.

This questionnaire is an initial opportunity for you and your organization to share your concerns, experiences, data sources, and vision for the coast. It is hoped that ongoing partnerships will be established among local, regional, state and federal groups during the development of the SMP that will continue in the future to support implementation efforts.
