- ❖ Brian – wants update on status report, would like product before CWO
 - CWO – 6 concurrent sessions
 - Need exposure to take to next step
- ❖ George – welcomed Jim – promised to invite CMANC to join the group 1.5 years ago

- ❖ Mud Budget
 - Will it give the ports an idea of the sediment coming into the ports/harbors
 - Report out in Nov/Dec?
 - Put into perspective amount of fine-grained material in the various regions and where does it go? Need documentation of where it goes.

 - CSMW initiated in 1999
 - Future of CSMW – how to incorporate other stakeholders
 - Master Plan goals
 - Restoring beaches – is that a part of sediment management?
 - Systematic way to manage sediments
 - State and Federal funding streams can be on vastly different schedules
 - Ongoing activities
 - Website
 - Updated with LA and SF Corps projects

- References Database – completed in 2005
 - Does this include ERDC papers?
- CSBAT – GIS tool
 - Jim
 - need to look at quantifying air pollution - Trucking, barge trips
 - CEQA requirements – may need multiple documents depending on transportation through various towns/cities
- SCOUP
 - Looking at regional management plans – obtained guidelines on how to consistently look at sediment
- Economics of RSM
 - King and Pendleton will work out issues/questions next summer – day use value
 - Beach Transfer model – will need to fund to improve model
 - Nationwide NOAA report (Judith Kildow – USC) – how does this tie in?
 - Broad perspective because it is from a national perspective
 - Looking at spending (fishing, etc), King is looking at value of beach (rather than how much people actually spend at the beach)
- CBReS
 - ID critically eroding areas along the coast
 - Put together along with what project involves, project costs
 - Look at potential RSM activities for the future
 - Comments from locals have been received
- Brochure
 - Getting 1000 copies printed – ICCE, CWO, Portland
- Sand loss from dams
 - Griggs' student (Matt Slagel)
 - Looks at sand lost from sediment trapped behind dams
- Master Plan Progress Report
 - Executive Summary (Brian) – Specific Products and their use (Table 1) – guide to the products, approach for different users
 - Out to CSMW for review 15 AUG 2006
 - Brian needs to clear thru Governor's office – need to say *"Preliminary Draft for Public Review"*
 - Brian needs to have by August 28th /September 1st
 - CSMW comments - August 23rd - send out Karen's version – please suggest wording and use track changes – send to Jim H.
 - Send comments to Susie

- 06-07 Budget
 - \$750K assistance to
 - San Francisco
 - Solana/Encinitas
 - San Clemente
 - \$600K for Master Plan and CCSTWS – SB/Ventura
- ❖ Cal Coast
 - 07-08 Budget:
 - SB 1127 – create loan program for salmon fishermen restricted by NOAA Fisheries – takes \$20M away from Boating and Waterways
 - SB 1125 – Resources Trust Fund, \$5M/yr for wetlands maintenance, also \$1M for Coastal Commission to help local governments finish their LCPs
 - Prop 84 - \$135M to Coastal Conservancy, \$90M for OPC
- ❖ Noyo Harbor
 - Western Coast Guard Commander requesting meeting with Col McMahon – Coast Guard cannot get into the harbor
 - Clean material
 - Usually on dredged every 5 years or so
 - Need a disposal area
 - Looked to State Parks for disposal
 - Can take to offshore disposal site - \$4M
 - Volume - ~200kcy
 - Karen Bane will send out email to North Coast contacts to see if there are any needs
 - Project at Fort Bragg – need for sand??
 - Problem is that the current disposal site is full – confined disposal area (diked area)
 - Could they get a 103 site
 - Place at Ocean Beach?
 - Looking to CalTrans to see if they need material
- ❖ Elk Horn Slough
 - Extended invitation to have CSMW meeting there so they can discuss their issues
 - Help rebuild interior wetlands
 - Elk Horn Slough foundation – asked for WRDA language that would cover the entire area
 - CSMW – areas within the jetties that have erosion spots – would like to have help with some of these smaller areas
