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❖ **Welcome and introductions (Chris Potter/Susie Ming)**

❖ **FY4 RSM Proposal and NSMA**

- SPD with endorsement from NWD, put forward a FY14 proposal for RSM for defining a west coast beneficial use zone.
- Chris Potter mentioned there may be other proposal regarding pilot project with John Warrick. Chris to follow up.
- John Dingler noted that the national RSM program has funded the SF wave sediment modeling off the SF coast.
- Perhaps a group discussion in regards to future RSM proposals.

❖ **Updates: Federal Agencies**

- USACE, LA District (Susie Ming)
  - Encinitas-Solana Beach – USACE and Cities were at the August hearing to speak on the revised findings. The CCC voted to approve the revised findings as written without any revisions. Partners are working with CCC and staff to find a way forward.
  - Pismo Beach – USACE and CCC staff working with legal to agree on condition language.
  - SLO RSM – public meeting to be held on 19 September to target the need/issues for a RSM in this region with the stakeholders and resource agencies.
- USACE, SF District (John Dingler)
  - Eureka RSM Plan – Copies of the latest draft were sent to the water board and DFW as well as the harbor district. No comments received so far. Decided to move forward with public meeting.
  - San Francisco Coastline RSM – ESA/PWA proposed completion approach is follows:
    - Late Aug/Early Sept - completion of Technical Memo series. For efficiency, we could combine Tech Memos 2 and 3, covering Analysis of

Implementation Options, Sea Level Rise and Erosion Hazard Zone Analysis, Constraints and Opportunities for CRSMP Reaches, Summary of Plan Implementation.

- Mid Sept - delivery of Admin Draft for ACE review (3 weeks)
- Mid Oct - delivery of public draft (date will depend on return of ACE review of the Admin Draft)
- 1st week of Nov - public meeting to present draft
- Before Thanksgiving - close of public comment period
- Dec - revision of draft report (undecided how to address public comments formally - that will be discussed once we see the content of the comments)
- End of the year/beginning of 2014 - Delivery of report depending on public comments content and need for revisions
- A Pacifica citizen submitted a FOIA with LA District for all ESA PWA and other groups regarding separately study by PWA on sharp park golf course. Office of Counsel responded with one email that met the request.
- Santa Cruz RSM
  - MOA/NOAA with Santa Cruz cell has been completed.
  - USACE held a meeting for North Half Moon Bay project with Maria Brown, Superintendent of Gulf of Farallones National Marine Sanctuary, that was also attended by Clif Davenport. Meeting attendees discussed potential flexibility within the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary (the GFNMS manages the section of the MBNMS north of the Santa Cruz-San Mateo County Line) regarding beneficial use of placement of sand. Regulations are clear that there cannot be disposal of dredged material in the sanctuary. The SPN and CSMW, however, are working with them to look at beneficial use as not disposal and revise guidelines for future use. Pilot project related to this Half Moon Bay project but would support CSMW's interests.
  - Part of NOAA scope of work is helping sanctuary interpretation of the regulations.
  - USACE pilot project description for red flag analysis to move forward, and Brad can use time to facilitate.
  - Sanctuaries are concerned with SLR and loss of beach and realize it is an important issue and willing to find some way to preserve the shoreline.
  - Sanctuary revisits their regs every 5 years with new cycle starting soon but not exactly sure when.

#### ❖ Updates: State Agencies

- Clif
  - City of Monterey and Division of Boating and Waterways completed contract transfer so that work could move forward. This includes the contract with PWA and Corps contract with Noble Consultants for the data collection.



- Sylvia Hunter division director (acting) supportive of BCP for Clif's position.
- Clif – contract OC parks to do the develop SCOUP plan finalized. Work with SUSAN Brodeur on that.
- Seagrass full proposals are out for review. Discuss next week all proposals.
- Webpage revisions last few months. Email to agency partners page. Contribute or edit what is already there and get it posted in the near future.
- Tamara and Sara are working on it for the park service.
- No WRDA news. BEACON still working. Letters due by 15<sup>th</sup> congressman.
- Webmapper progressing. Long URL affecting the load up time.
- Coordinating efforts with state geoportal and oceans page put together with OPC efforts. October available (will confirm). Support for webmapper having Alyssa purchase order in place by end of this year– decision support tool. Separate from oceans page and lot more data on CSMW website relates to sediments.
- Coastal Commission (Lesley Ewing)
  - Guidance on Sea Level Rise in the next month or so – perhaps September. Release for review document. Will then be revised and formally adopted at a CCC hearing early next year.
  - OPC LCP grants are still being reviewed and will be adopted at October hearing.

#### ❖ Updates: NGOs

- CalCoast (Steve Aceti)
  - AB976 CCC authority administrative fines passed assembly and released senate props and voted this week on senate floor. Trial period ends 2019 instead of 2017.
  - SB461 appropriate tidelands and oil revenue \$6M but not more than \$10M annually to six agencies to address SLR and Climate Change. Currently held up with senate approps.
  - Newsletter – Port Hueneme and emergency beach erosion situation. State senate policy committee \$2M supported build revetment. City saying that the sequestration affected federal funding. Hesitation in senate committee state backfilling for sequestration cuts.
